5 Competition Rules and Methods

(1) Competition Rules

- ① The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing rules of sailing (RRS), or as otherwise specified in this document.
- ② No national prescriptions will apply.
- ③ If there is a conflict between languages, the English text will take precedence.
- ④ Appendix P will apply.
- ⑤ Decisions of the international jury will be final as provided in RRS 70.5.
- ⑥ [DP] denotes a rule for which the penalty is at the discretion of the Protest Committee.
- ⑦ [SP] denotes a rule for which a standard penalty may be applied by the Race Committee without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1 and A5.

(3) Number of racing and Scoring

[Laser, Laser Radial, Tasar]

- ① A maximum of 10 races will be held during the competition period. When four or more races have been completed, the total race score shall be the sum obtained by totaling the scores of these races excluding the worst score.
- ② One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.

[Hansa 303]

- ① A maximum of 7 races will be held during the competition period. When four or more races have been completed, the total race score shall be the sum obtained by totaling the scores of these races excluding the worst score.
- ② One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.

7 Eligibility

Competitors must be members of each member national authority of World Sailing.

8 Consideration for disabled persons who participate in the general category competition.

In this event, consideration shall be taken for disabled participants in the general category competition. The content of consideration according to the types of disabilities is the following:

Persons with physical impairments

Assistance for getting on and off the boat

Provide assistance to those who are unable to get on and off the boat on their own.

Accompaniment of a person to help a disabled athlete with impairments

Take care to provide a helper to accompany a disabled athlete with impairments to the competition area.

Persons with vision impairments

Assistance for getting on and off the boat

Provide assistance to those who are unable to get on and off the boat on their

own.

- **Broadcast communication**

Information will be broadcasted to inform competitors of the progress and situation of the competition.

- **Accompaniment of a person to help a disabled athlete**

Take care to provide a helper to accompany a disabled athlete to the competition area.

Persons with hearing impairments

- **Consideration for providing information on a bulletin board.**

The competition status shall be broadcasted and displayed on the bulletin board.

- **Installation of a communication board**

A communication board will be installed to facilitate communication.

- **Accompaniment of a person to help a disabled athlete**

Take care to provide a helper to accompany a disabled athlete to the competition area.

Persons with intellectual impairments

- **Consideration to provide easy-to-understand explanations**

Provide easy-to-understand explanations of the competition rules.

- **Installation of a communication board**

A communication board will be installed to facilitate communication.

- **Accompaniment of a person to help an athlete with impairments**

Take care to provide a helper to accompany an athlete with impairments to the competition area.

Persons with mental impairments

9 Age Requirement

Minimum age is 30 (born on or before 31 December 1992)

In line with the sport-specific rules, an athlete must compete in their designated age group, with your age determined as at 31 December 2022. For example, if you are 45 during Games time but have turned 46 by 31 December 2022, you would compete in the 46+ age category.

10 Medal Ceremony

A medal will be awarded to the first-ranked athlete in each event.

Medals will be awarded to the first to third-ranked athletes by event and by age category. Provided, however, that when the number of participants is three or less, only the first-ranked athlete will be awarded with the medal.

11 Registration Fee

(1) Competition participation fee (including tax and handling fee)

① Competitors (Basic fee: allowed to participate in 5 disciplines)

a) Overseas participants: 24,000 yen per person

(Including a transportation pass for mobility in the Kansai area.)

b) Domestic participants: 15,000 yen per person

(Does not include a transportation pass. Could be bought optionally at an additional cost.)

② Persons related to the competition (Basic fee)

a) Overseas participants: 14,000 yen per person

(Including a transportation pass for mobility in the Kansai area.)

b) Domestic participants: 5,000 yen per person

(Does not include a transportation pass. Could be bought optionally at an additional cost.)

*When a helper (a person who supports an athlete with impairment participating in a competition) participates in the competition for providing such support, he/she is required neither to apply for participation in the competition nor to pay a registration participation fee (provided, however, that the helper must apply for participation as a competition official when he/she requires a kit for participating in the competition, a transportation pass and others).

(2) Additional charges (extra fee)

(3) Competition equipment rental

- 50,000 yen for a laser boat and laser radial boat. (For overseas participants only)
- 100,000 yen for a Taser boat. (For overseas participants only)

12 Entry

Application is made through the entry system on the official website (Entry System) dedicated to the application for the entry to the competition via PC or smartphone.

13 Notes on Participation

(1) Clothing

All athletes must wear an appropriate personal floating device at all times. Wet suits and dry suits are not considered as appropriate life jackets. If the buoyancy device of a life jacket is inflatable, it must be worn inflated on the water at all times. This has been changed RRS40.

(2) Competition equipment, etc.

① Equipment Regulations

- Except for Hansa 303, Japanese participants must participate with their own boats.
- Overseas participants may charter a boat if they need.
- Disabled athletes with impairments may use support equipment depending on impairments.

② Requirements of transportation and berthing

- Athletes must submit a notification in advance for bringing in and taking out a boat.
- The boat brought in must be berthed at a designated place.

③ Deposit for boat rental (guarantee fee)

- When renting a boat, the hull insurance fee must be paid as a deposit and settled after the end of the competition.
- Deposit: 100,000 yen

(3) Insurance

- ① The organiser will subscribe to accident insurance for participants, but this insurance is applicable only to “injuries incurred during the competition in the competition venues” of the “competition participants and persons related to the competition”, and does not cover all kinds of risks during the competition. Therefore, all persons taking part in the competition are requested to subscribe to required insurance at own risk and costs.

- ② Athletes must either pay compensation of 100 million yen or more per incident, or must be subscribed to a valid third party liability insurance with an equivalent amount.

〈Disclaimer of Liability〉

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

(4) Doping Control

- ① The doping control in accordance with the [World Anti-Doping Code](#) and [the rules of the International Masters Games Association](#) shall apply to this competition.
- ② Anti-doping activities (doping inspections and anti-doping education activities) shall be conducted in accordance with [the rules of the International Masters Games Association](#).
- ③ Participants are deemed to have agreed to be subject to doping control procedures in accordance with [the rules of the International Masters Games Association](#) upon entry to the competition. Participants are advised to check [the rules of the International Masters Games Association](#) Rules for more details.
- ④ This competition aims to promote anti-doping activities as an activity to protect clean sports and clean athletes in order to leave various values of sports to the next generation through sports in cooperation with the Japan Anti-Doping Agency.

(5) Radio Communication

Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones. [DP]

(6) Sailing Instructions

The sailing instructions will be posted on the WMG2021 website after the entry closing date.

(7) Advertising

Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority. If this rule is broken, World Sailing Regulation 20.9.2 applies. [DP]

(8) Media Rights

All copyrights regarding the event are owned by the organizing authority.
Athletes and supporters agree that their boats and their images and names will be exposed to the broadcast, publication, advertising media, etc.

15 Others

The participant must bring a valid photo identification and complete registration process personally by one day before the competition. (No exception will not be allowed.) Furthermore, even when participating in team competitions or as a team, each participant must complete accreditation process.

Accreditation process can be completed at any of designated service desks; however, operation hours and dates differ depending on the location.
